I am happy with this addition because it helps relate my paper to the target audience of people in their twenties and to my own life, as I will be entering the workforce in a couple of years.

My ideal version of this project would discuss more of the personal and cultural implications of gender socialization. I feel that I can dig deeper into my own experiences, while still staying in my comfort zone of what I would submit to be graded and ultimately publish in my e-portfolio. I also believe I can find research about societal trends that may be more thought-provoking or a little more exciting to a wide audience.
